Over the past 6 years, the Z-HOPE™ “fever” has permeated the air! Our Community service program has provided a template that has been duplicated by many organizations because of its unique features. During these last two years, the Z-HOPE™ emphasis has been on focused initiatives. Consequently, many bonus Z-point initiatives were launched to encourage chapters and auxiliaries to choose them for implementation in their community. Submitted grants and secured external funding totaling **\$ 86,500.00** to assist in program implementation. Over **100 chapters** received financial incentives from external funding to implement the funded initiatives receiving a total of **\$ 55,825.00** {representing 84% of the total funds secured by grants and contracts}.
