Instructions and Criteria for Judging

QUIZ BOWL

For the quiz bowl each ZYA must study their own handbook and learn critical information about their respective affiliate. Participants must be on a team of 3 and answer questions for points. At the end of a single round, the team with the highest points will progress to play the next team and so on and so forth. The competition will end when there are no more teams to challenge. Competition winners will be based on the highest number of points scored in the single round. In the event of a tie, there will be one tie breaker question for double the points. Advisors must sign groups up for the quiz bowl by submitting the form in this packet to the South Central Region's Youth Coordinator.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENT (A & A-B HONOR ROLL)

A copy of 1st and 2nd nine weeks report card of the 2022-2023 school year must be submitted and accompany the form included in this packet. Participants must be registered attendees of the conference in order to be recognized. Information for recognition must be received by: June 1, 2023. Please email to scr.youthcoordinator@gmail.com

- K-5th Grades- The Youth must have been on their school's Honor Roll with All A's or All A's and B's at the end of the 1st and 2nd second nine-week reporting period. (Grades 6-12) a G.P.A of 3.0 or above.
- A completed Honor Roll Recognition Form must be received by the deadline. Names submitted without all necessary information will not be recognized.
- Each Youth recognized as an Honor Roll student will receive a certificate.

ZYA CLUB REPORT

ZYA may submit typed written report that showcases and summarizes the activities of the year. Reports may not exceed 5 pages in length and must be doubled spaced with 1 inch margins, appropriate headings and 12 point Times New Roman font. All reports must be turned in by June 1, 2023. ZYA SCRAPBOOKS

Scrapbooks will be evaluated on the following criteria. Minimum and maximum points for each criterion are indicated.

MEMORY BOOKS (Individual)

Memory books will be evaluated on the following criteria. The maximum points for each criterion are indicated. *No more than 2 books may be entered by a chapter for each group*. Sponsors should help select the books that will be entered.

Creativity/Originality (Maximum 25 points)

The book should be presented in a way that is representative of Zeta's youth

• Contents (Maximum 25 points)

 The book should contain items about the youth, a member or members of the Zeta family, activities in which the member or group has participated and received awards, recognition, etc. It may contain achievements from a school group, community service project, a church activity, etc.

Organization (Maximum 25 points)

Each memory book should have a table of contents clearly identifying where to find items within the book. The cover should contain the name of the Youth member and club affiliation. Pages should be numbered and the material in the book should include but not exceed one year. New youth club members (those who have not been a part of the organization for one year) may submit memory books starting with any recruitment activities and close with the last event prior to the SCR Leadership Conference.

Neatness (Maximum 15 points)

 All entries in the book should be neatly trimmed, marked clearly in blue or black ink or with typed labels and dates.

• Color (Maximum 10 points)

Memory books should have a blue and/or white cover (club colors).

All memory books must be turned in during registration on June 28, 2023.

GRADUATING SENIORS

High School Seniors completing High School in 2019 will be recognized. Youth must be a registered attendee of the conference in order to be recognized. *Not a competition but a recognition. Graduating seniors list must be submitted by June 1, 2023 to scr.youthcoordinator@gmail.com.

ORATORICAL CONTEST

Participants may choose from any of the following current topics:

- Zeta's Youth: Providing Hope Through Community Service
- Humility, Opportunity, Preparation, and Exaltation: Challenges for the Success of Zeta's Youth
- Youth: Zeta's Legacy and Hope

Guidelines for Oratorical Contest

- Each participant will draw a number which will represent the order in which the oration will be presented.
- A time limit of five minutes will be permitted for orations.
- Participants will deliver oration from memory. Points will be deducted if notes are relied upon.
- Each participant will introduce herself by stating in complete sentences:
- My name is
- Age and Grade
- Advising Chapter Name and City
- Topic (Time begins when topic is stated)
- A designated timekeeper will indicate wrap-up time one minute before time expires. Time will be called at the end of that one-minute period. The timekeeper will also be responsible for the accuracy of the judges' tally of score sheets and ranking form.
- Judging will be tabulated on a standard form that will be provided for each judge.
 - Judging Scale: 5=Excellent; 4=Above average; 3=Average, 2=Fair; 1=Poor
- Participants will be evaluated on the following criteria:

Delivery	Content and Organization
Eye contact adequate?	Clear statement of main idea?
Posture acceptable?	Clear organization of idea?
Gestures effective?	Effective transitions?
Voice-volume and rate appropriate?	Enough supporting evidence?

- All participants will receive an award for participation. The participants with the highest points will be declared the first, second, and third place winners in respective order of points. In case of a tie for 1st place, the participant with the highest total in aplomb and voice quality will be declared the 1st place winner. The judges' decision will be final.
- A minimum of 3 participants must sign up for the Oratorical Contest. If there are not at least 3 participants, the Oratorical Contest will not be held.

SPELLING BEE

- Once you have signed up to participate in the Spelling Bee, study each of the words on the list included in this packet. These are sample words and additional, age appropriate words may be used as well.
- Learn the meaning, origin, part of speech, how to use them, and how to *spell* them. Practice, practice, practice.

Rules:

- The contest director will select an individual who can clearly and accurately pronounce each of the words on the spelling list.
- The caller will call the contestant's number and pronounce the word the contestant is requested to spell. A panel of three (3) judges will signal an incorrect spelling by ringing a bell or other method determined by spelling bee director.
- In the first ten (10) rounds, a contestant will have two (2) chances to spell the word before the caller moves to the next contestant. Beginning with the 11th round, contestants will have one chance to spell a word correctly before the caller moves on to the next word or contestant. The number of rounds may be changed at the discretion of the contest director. For ten (10) rounds or less, the two (2) chances to spell a word will end after the fifth (5th) round.
- The contestant may ask for the word to be said a second time, may ask for the word to be used in a sentence, or may ask for the word to be identified by origin.
- No talking or coaching may be done while the contestants are on the stage or in the room where the contest is held.
- Contestants, friends, and family members are expected to be courteous and considerate of other contestants.
- No word lists, charts, books, or other props will be allowed in the contest area.
- Each contestant should enlist the aid of a youth advisor, family member, teacher, or friend to act as your spelling coach to help you.
- The age-appropriate list will be used until all of the words have been used. Thereafter, words may be used from a different word list to lead to elimination of contestants and determine a winner.
